
CLASS 2

In maths the year 1 children have applied their knowledge of parts and the whole of fruit to show the whole and parts of a number. They have used a part, part whole model to partition numbers to 5.

In art we continued to focus on concentric circles and used our collage skills to create work inspired by Henri Matisse.
