Well, what a busy week we have had! Parent's Evening, swimming and finally our Blists Hill trip this Friday. We shall share some photos next week with you.



Our focus text this week has been a story called 'The Ironbridge Ogre', another story by a local author which was written for the 'Telford 50' celebrations in 2018. It is about a grumpy ogre who has never left Ironbridge and a little girl who shows him the delights of the local area. Lots of the children said they had been to Ironbridge and the places the ogre visits, which really brought the story to life. We then wrote our own sentences about where we would like to take the Ironbridge ogre.

In phonics we have revised the sounds oo (look at a book), ar (start the car), or (shut the door), and air (that's not fair).

In Maths, Reception have been looking at the composition of 7. We have thought about the different ways we can make 7, and focused on it as '5 and 2 more'.



Year 1 have been working on doubles in Maths, and then moved on to using our doubling facts to work out near doubles, such as $6+7$ or $5+6$.


Class 2 have worked really hard AGAIN this week! This week the children have been learning all about Church Aston and how it has changed over time in history. The children looked at similarities and differences within Church Aston village and the school.



In maths year 2 children have been looking at fractions, we have looked at $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ and the children have been making fraction tiles to help them to remember the parts to make a whole. The children have even started to look at reasoning problems. Well done year 2!


