Have an enjoyable bank holiday.



CLASS 1

We have been busy bees this week with lots of lovely, exciting learning going on in Class One!



Our focus text this week has been 'Giraffes Can't Dance' by Giles Andreae. A lot of the children were already familiar with this book so it has been a popular choice! Year One wrote positive sentences with exclamation marks at the end about Gerald the giraffe's dancing to cheer him up after the other animals were mean to him! Reception wrote adjectives to describe the animals in the story. We made some lovely giraffe masks too, can you tell



who is wearing their Gerald disguise in this picture?







In maths, Reception have been using a ten frame and a dice frame to show different numbers.

Year 1's have been making bundles of ten and counting in tens. They have been finding missing numbers and counting on from any given number up to 100.

In our free choice time, the children have been taking turns on the iPads. They have been independently finding their names on a tick list, setting their own five-minute timer, carrying out a set computing task and then finding the next two children on the list to let them know it is their turn. We have been so impressed with their independence when carrying out this task.



In geography the children learned about compass points focusing on the language 'North, South, East and West.' We had to move along the map, with a grid to find different African animals and places. It was quite challenging because we had to follow to or three instructions, in sequence, to move around the map. Then the children were asked to make a map with African animals and program the Beebots

to move around the map from animal to animal, place to plac<mark>e using an algorithm.</mark>







In computing we have been listening to 'The Planets' by Gustav Holst. We discussed how the music made us feel and then we used the app Chrome Music Lab to create our own rhythms and patterns and linked them to animals we would find on safari. We enjoyed exploring the instruments.
